Hedges: The following plants can produce good hedges in their own right or as creative mixtures

Plant	Common name	Deciduous or evergreen
<i>Carpinus betulus</i>	Hornbeam	Deciduous
<i>Crataegus monogyna</i>	Hawthorn	Deciduous
<i>Cupressus macrocarpa</i>	Monterey cypress	Evergreen
<i>Elaeagnus x ebbingei</i>	-	Evergreen
<i>Euonymus japonicus</i>	Japanese spindle	Evergreen
<i>Griselinia littoralis</i>	Kapuka or New Zealand broadleaf	Evergreen
<i>Laurus nobilis</i>	Bay laurel	Evergreen
<i>Olearia x haastii</i>	Daisy bush	Evergreen
<i>Prunus spinosa</i>	Blackthorn	Deciduous
<i>Rosa rugosa</i>	Ramanas rose	Deciduous
<i>Thuja plicata</i>	Western red cedar	Evergreen

Trees: The following trees are tolerant of full sea wind exposure.

Plant	Common name	Deciduous or evergreen	Maximum mature size
<i>Acer pseudoplatanus</i>	Sycamore	Deciduous	Up to 40 metres and 20 metres wide
<i>Alnus glutinosa</i>	Common alder	Deciduous	30m high 10m wide
<i>Carpinus betulus</i>	Hornbeam	Deciduous	20m high 8m wide
<i>Crataegus monogyna</i>	Common hawthorn	Deciduous	10m high 5m wide
<i>Cupressus macrocarpa</i>	Monterey cypress	Evergreen	40m high 2.5m wide
<i>Pinus pinaster</i>	Maritime pine	Evergreen	20m high 1.2m wide
<i>Pinus radiata</i>	Monterey pine	Evergreen	30m high 8m wide
<i>Populus alba</i>	White poplar	Deciduous	35m high 20m wide
<i>Quercus cerris</i>	Turkey oak	Deciduous	30m high 15m wide
<i>Salix alba</i>	White willow	Deciduous	25m high 15m wide
<i>Thuja plicata</i>	Western red cedar	Evergreen	15m high 5m wide
